# Teachers' Notes

**AIM** To revise and practice the present continuous for future arrangements

**LEVEL** Pre-intermediate

**TIME** 30 – 40 minutes

## PROCEDURE

- Cut up the strips. Make enough sets for groups of three or four.
- Start the lesson by revising the target language e.g. Is anybody going away this weekend? Are you going out this evening?
- Give out a set of strips to each group and ask them to match them. Warn Ss that questions don't always come first!
- Plenary check. One group calls out a first part, another group responds.
- (Optional) If you have twenty-four (or more) Ss, give each a strip and use it as a "find your partner" exercise. Ss should memorise their strip and return it to T before milling.
