## TEACHERS NOTES

- AIMS:** To identify types of word (noun, verb, adjective etc.)  
Vocabulary building
- LEVEL:** Elementary / pre-intermediate
- TIME:** 40 minutes
- PROCEDURE:**
- Put the words 'a telephone' and 'to telephone' on the board, and ask students what the difference is between the two. Hopefully the words 'noun' and 'verb' will be developed.
  - Ask students if they can think of any other types of word (e.g. adjective, adverb, preposition etc.) If necessary, briefly go over the differences at this point.
  - Give out the worksheets and get the students (individually at first) to group the words together (five groups of 10 words).
  - Students compare answers in pairs, then small groups.
  - Teacher checks answers with whole class.
  - Finally, class establish what kind of word is represented by each group.
